## IV. School Reports:

A. Principal: John Hantke Welcome and he is very excited to see so many people here tonight to support our PAC. A weekly newsletter is sent out weekly on Sundays called "The Scoop" if you do not receive the email link with The Scoop please contact the office and they will assist with getting it. The Scoop can also be read via the school website. This year the students have grown from 639 to 710 at the start of year.
Facilities: The large gym has been completed, last fall and floor and logo were completed and since May, Dean Lauze (local artist) has been working on the murals for all 4 walls, It is completed and looks amazing, within the murals all Stafford feeder schools along with LSS are represented. Will look at making a video to show all families the completed project but best way to see is to come support Stafford at an upcoming game/event.

The lockers are almost done, hopefully they will be finished by Friday and students will be able to get a locker by Wednesday. The school will supply the combination locks used and will spend time helping make sure all new students know how to open their locks. Each teacher will have a master list of all the combinations for the classroom. The lockers are all situated just outside the doors of the student's home classroom. The students are encouraged to decorate and make their lockers their own, but whatever they put on will have to be able to be removed in June.

The vyinyls are here and hopefully will be put up around school before Thanksgiving.
This year there are 4 SEA's and 3 resource staff added at the school.
The extra clubs at the school should be starting soon. There will be a schedule sent out with dates, times and location of the extra clubs so that students and families can see what is happening. This will also be posted on the Website as well as through The Scoop.

WEB (Where everyone belongs) leaders are grade 8 students who help out around the school, assist the grade 6's, peer tutoring, breakfast program, etc. This year they will also have a chance to go to our feeder schools to help out with activities there.

The Breakfast program will be starting up again with hot breakfast available for all students in the community room from 8-8:30. It is funded by Breakfast Clubs Canada but needs parent volunteers to cook, serve and clean up.

The breaks during the school day are a quick 15 minute recess in am, for lunch students have 13 minutes eating time and then 22 minutes outside. There are some teachers that allow eating during class time and some don't. Lack of eating time has been an ongoing issue at the school.
B. Vice Principal: Erin Favero not in attendance.

As per Mr Hantke The VP role at school is health and safety at school (Students and Staff) The VP and Principal work well together and make a great team.
C. Community Coordinator: Kinder Sander (not in attendance)

As per Gina T. There are 2 events coming up and how the community is supporting families that have
just arrived in Canada and families in need. Through Glenwood elementary families can book an appointment to get hygiene supplies, clothing, and shoes. There is a program through the schools, SWIS teams (settlement workers in schools) which help with transportation, English classes, employment, looking to see if they can set up a social page so that families from same countries can connect. Kinder does have school supplies for students who need it and also there is a lunch program at the school for students in need (need to sign up with Kinder). The breakfast program is open to all students at Stafford, There will be some after school clubs set up for new to Canada students. Kinder also has some bikes which are available. On October 19 there will be a Resource Fair for families. Not sure exactly what that is so check the Scoop for more info. There are plenty of community supports around to help.

There will be a Fall Fair at the end of October starting at 4:30 ( has been cancelled), The PAC will be a part of that so we will discuss later. Also there is a Meet the Teacher BBQ evening on September 22 , which we will discuss PAC involvement.
